

Too often confused with other Scandinavian countries, this southernmost Nordic nation has been characterized by stereotypes and clichés related to socialism, cradle-to-grave security, football and Hamlet. The book details Denmark's substantial contributions to science, engineering, exploration, seafaring, literature, philosophy, music, architecture, and many other fields. Brief portraits depict wellknown Danes, including "Clown Prince of Denmark" Victor Borge, Hans Christian Andersen, Kierkegaard, and Out of Africa author Karen Blixen. Norman Berdichevsky teaches Hebrew at the University of Central Florida. He is also a professional translator from Hebrew and Danish to English, and lived in Denmark from 1978 to 1985.




